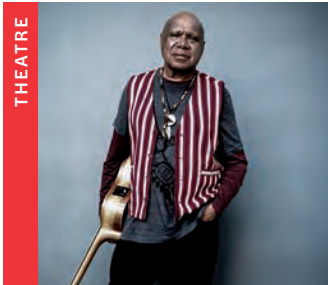

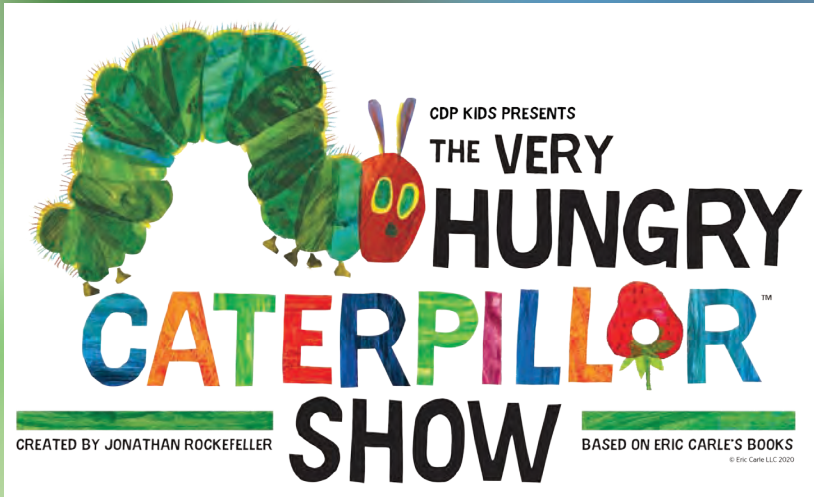

Contemporary composer, Bryce Dessner, has composed a new score full of emotional power. Best known as a founder of American rock band The National and for his film scores for *The Revenant* and *The Two Popes*, Dessner was initially inspired by the tragedy of the Australian bush fires and the Notre-Dame fire in Paris. 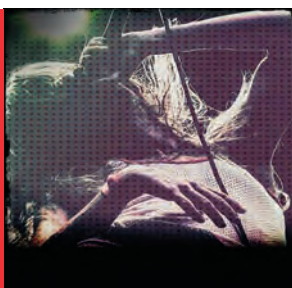

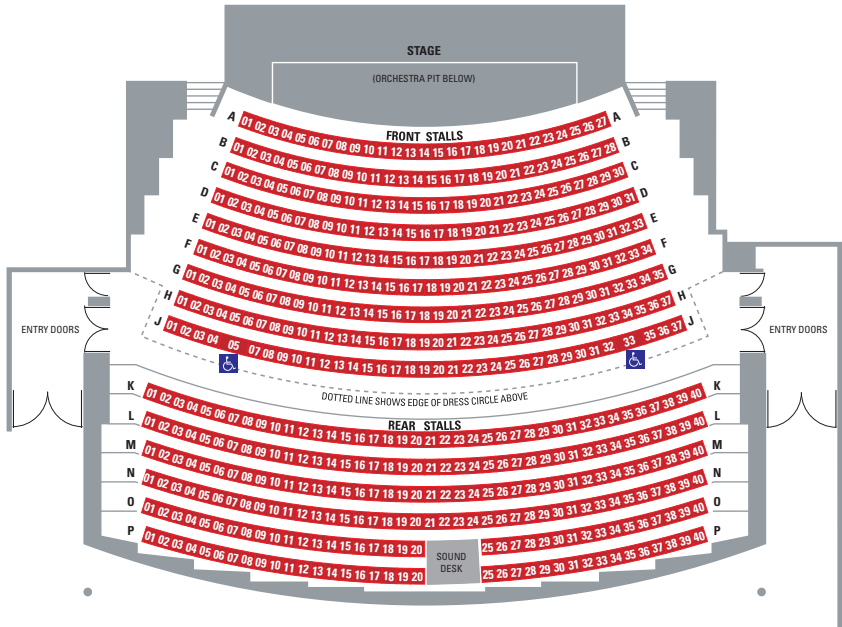

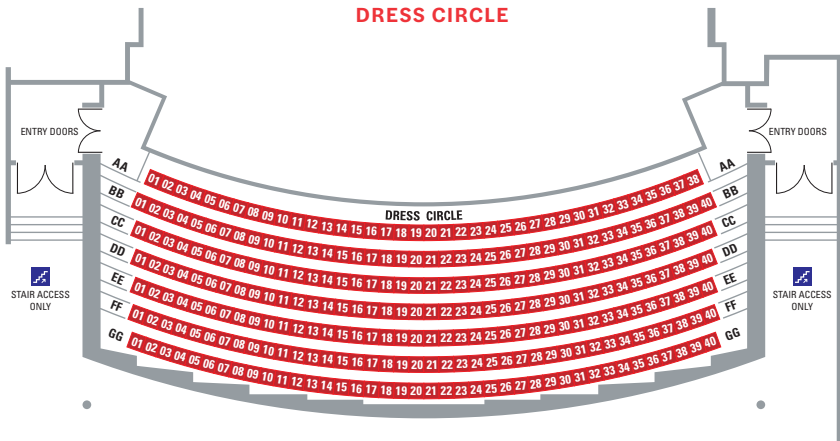

Theatre Seating Plan

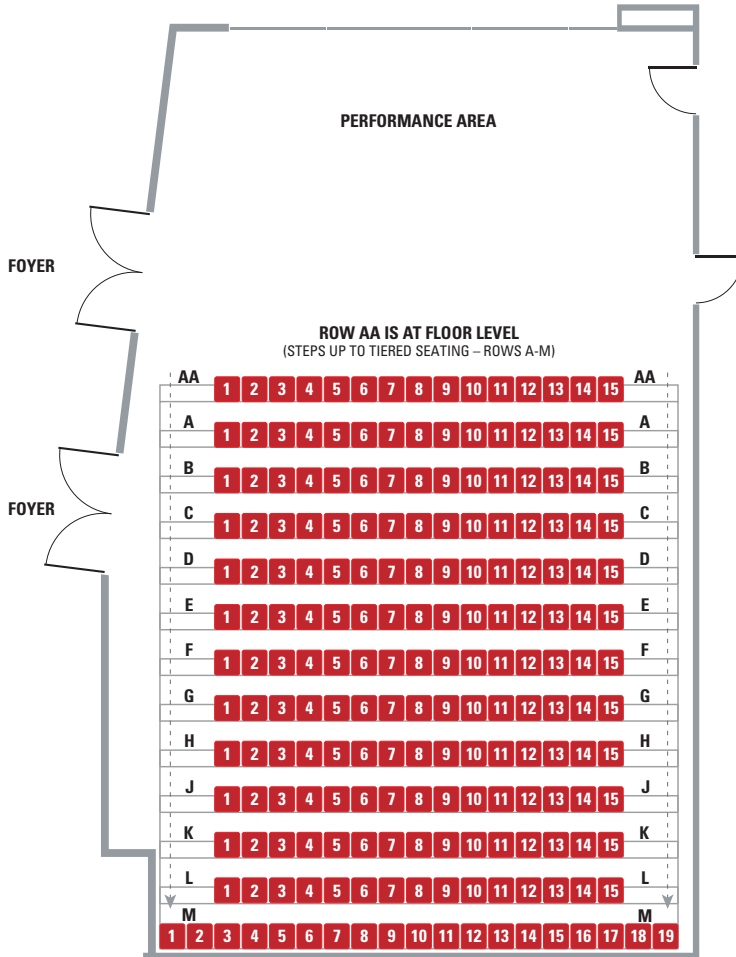
