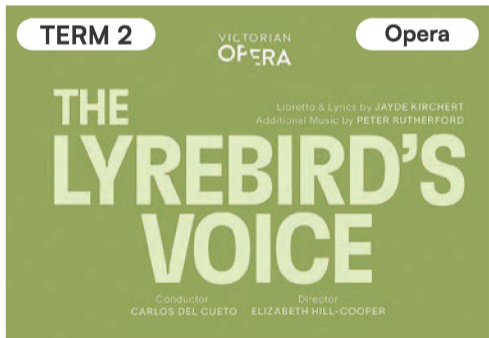

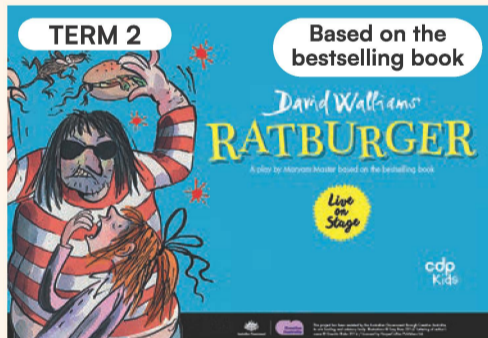
Shake & Stir Theatre Co

 In this family-friendly opera you'll meet a quirky assortment of native animals and discover the power of being different.



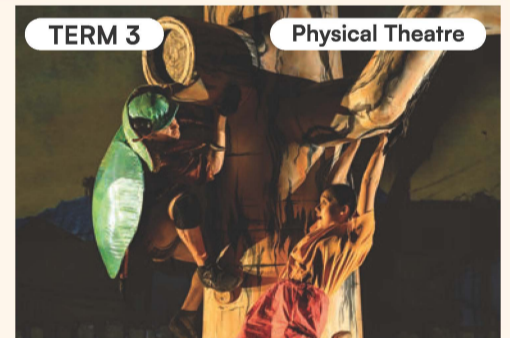
